- You need to apply for a residence permit. This is valid for five years and should be issued within six months of your arrival.

Writing a CV and application letter in Ireland

- The key focus of your CV should be to persuade the employer to invite you for an interview. Therefore your CV is a marketing tool, which should be adapted to the market in which you intend to use it.
- When your letter is a response to an advertisement, it should be brief and merely introduce your CV.

The application procedure in Ireland

- Compared to the UK, Ireland focuses more on the personal development of the applicant, and not as much on results.
- In Ireland, speculative applications are common.

Management culture in Ireland

- After work colleagues often go for a drink. However be prepared to be on time again the next morning!
- Planning and strategy are usually for short term goals.
