- The resident permit needs to be renewed every 5 years.

- A Romanian CV includes information on your education, qualifications, skills, knowledge, experience and responsibilities.
- The application letter is usually typed. Handwritten letters are sometimes requested.

The application procedure in Romania

- The local offices of the employment services (Oficiul Fortei de Munca) often advertise their vacancies in local newspapers.
- Speculative applications can be very successful in Romania.

Management culture in Romania

- Most business is done at an informal level in Romania, so establish personal relationships are important.
- Romanians are commonly casual and less formal.
